

**Marc Marquez**  
Pole

has taken his first pole position since Hungary last year (245 days ago). This is his third pole position at Jerez, along with 2014 and 2024, and his 75<sup>th</sup> in MotoGP.

will be aiming to take his second Sprint win so far this year along with Brazil, and to equal Jorge Martin as the riders with most Sprint wins (17 wins). This would be his second Sprint win at Jerez (along with last year).

**Johann Zarco**  
P2

has qualified second via Q1, equalling his best qualifying result with Honda from Germany last year.

will be aiming to take his maiden Sprint win, which would also be Honda's first Sprint win, and to become the 10<sup>th</sup> different Sprint winner on the current full-time grid, the 11<sup>th</sup> overall.

**Fabio Di Giannantonio**  
P3

has qualified third for his third top three in qualifying in a row after Brazil and the USA, when he was on pole. This is his best qualifying result in MotoGP at Jerez.

will be aiming to take his maiden Sprint win.

**Marco Bezzecchi**  
P4

has qualified fourth, which is the first time he has failed to qualify in the top three since he qualified 14<sup>th</sup> in Malaysia last year. That is also the last time he didn't take a podium in either the Sprint and/or the Grand Prix race.

**Alex Marquez**  
P5

has qualified fifth for his best qualifying result since he was second in Valencia last year.

will be aiming to take his first Sprint podium (or win) since Valencia last year.

**Pedro Acosta**  
P6

has qualified sixth for his best qualifying result in MotoGP at Jerez.

will be aiming to take his second Sprint win along with Thailand earlier this year. This would be KTM's second Sprint win at Jerez along with Brad Binder in 2023.
